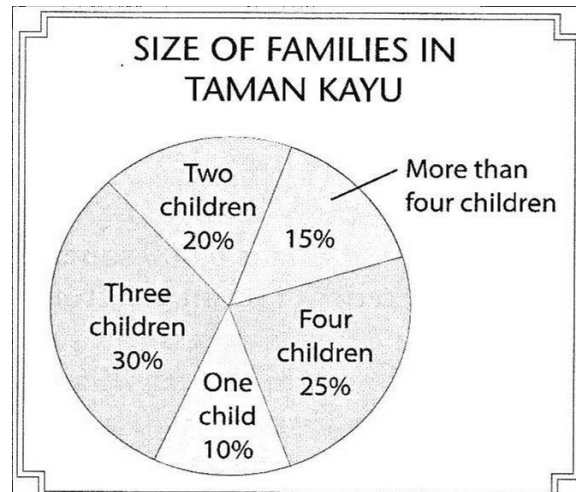

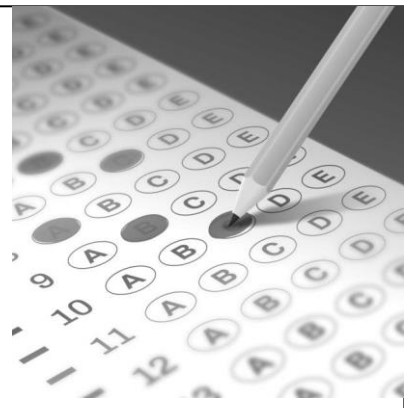

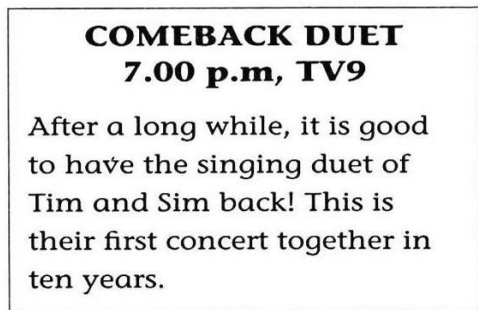

The famous Family Grilled Chicken is my favourite restaurant.
